TUITION FEES


In 2002, the newly-elected BC Liberal government deregulated tuition fees, allowing them to double in just three years, bringing them from the 2nd lowest in Canada to 7% more than the national average (\$5,040 per year).


As a result of the Campbell government's tuition fee policies, student debt in BC sits at highest in Canada outside of the Maritimes, at an average of \$27,000 for students completing a four-year program.

The BC government's own figures show that it will be collecting more money from tuition fees in 2011 than corporate income tax.

STUDENT AID

After the BC Liberal government cut the provincial grants program, BC fell to dead last in Canada for the provision of non-repayable student aid—60% below the national average.





STUDENT LOAN INTEREST RATES

BC's system of high tuition fees and high-interest loans means that those who cannot afford to pay upfront and borrow actually end up paying more for their education thanks to compound interest payments.

PROVINCIAL FUNDING

Per student funding in BC has been cut over the past eight years, resulting in higher tuition fees and more student debt. If the government had simply frozen funding increases at the rate of inflation in 2001, funding would be 15% higher today.
