Alberta CAW Members Protest a Lack of Respect and Demand Change

On Thursday October 6, 2010 over 80 DHL employees, members of CAW Local 4050 in Alberta, staged an early morning protest to demand that DHL management respect their right to be heard, respected and included in the success of the company and to demand that DHL stop ignoring their collectively elected voice, namely the Canadian Auto Workers Union. The CAW/DHL Corporate Council made the decision to participate on behalf of the Canadian DHL workers in the Global Delivery Respect for DHL workers campaign being put on by UNI Global Union and International Transport Federation. This protest was a coordinated effort by the CAW/DHL Corporate Council with the goal of raising awareness to DHL employees across the country on issues and problems facing DHL employees worldwide and to state to DHL management that the lack

of respect shown by DHL has to stop. This was a Canada wide protest held at DHL facilities in Brampton, Ontario; Winnipeg, Manitoba; Regina and Saskatoon, Saskatchewan; Calgary, and Edmonton Alberta; Burnaby, Richmond and Abbotsford, British Columbia. Employees wore Tee Shirts with the Caption "RESPECT FOR WORKERS". Some examples of the major issues facing DHL people country wide which have prompted the call to action are as follows:

- 1. Supervisors performing bargaining work
- 2. Constant re-routing
- 3. Health and safety not being taken seriously
- 4. Lack of respect for the grievance process
- 5. Amount of grievances still unresolved

The Edmonton Employees conducted their show of Solidarity in the early A.M. with help from Owner Operator Shop Steward Robbie Smith and Barry Dittman. Thanks to Karen Caig as well for her involvement in setting up the Edmonton show of solidarity. Over 30 employees participated and sent a clear message to DHL which is that we want to be respected and we want our union to be taken seriously. The protest shirts are continuing to be worn on shift by the hourly warehouse employees.

The Calgary Employees sent the same message with 40 employees participating. The Hourly employees that were on shift at the time wore the protest shirts while working. Jenny Ahn (Director of Mobilization and Political Action), Todd Romanow (National Rep), and Trevor Alway (Local 4050 President) spoke at the event and the employees were all very excited to be part of this show of strength. Sister Ahn relayed the importance of political action and issues surrounding the municipal elections and CPP fight. Brother Romanow raised awareness of the internal fight the union is having to constantly have with the company to get them to honor the CBA. Brother Alway spoke on the large amount of unresolved grievances, Quality pay procedure violations, bargaining agreement violations such as the 80/20 New Payment Methodology grievance and on the topics of organizing, communication. Corrine Aubin (Local 2002), Murray Gore (National Organizer) and Susan Spratt (Area Director) were also in attendance.

Brother Alway thanked the Calgary members for their show of solidarity in June of this year when they walked off the job to save their livelihoods as well as for attending the workers demand respect rally on this day. These CAW members in Alberta are truly heroes in this fight for respect. This was the first multi location protest that Local 4050 has staged and I look forward to seeing how the company responds to this hugely successful show of ITF/UNI Global Delivery Campaign "DHL WORKERS DEMAND RESPECT"
